About the Goat Alliance

The activities of Rocky Mountain Goat Alliance (RMGA) are guided by the board of directors and are achieved in three main categories: Citizen Science, Education, and a Research and a Conservation Grant Program.

Mountain goats are considered one of the least studied and least understood ungulates worldwide. Wildlife professionals don't often receive the necessary funding for their research compared to other North American game species. Supporting RMGA helps fill these critical research gaps which inform the allotment of hunting tags, educates the public on goat interactions, and provides updated habitat and population information to inform wildlife and conservation decision-making.

RMGA's core audience are hunters, hikers, outdoor adventurers, and wildlife enthusiasts who find common ground in the steep, high altitude habitat favored by mountain goats. Whether supporters spread the word about goat conservation, become members, or support a direct conservation program through annual giving, there is a place for all to support mountain goats.

Giving is most impactful when the donor loves the purpose and project associated with their gift. RMGA has several areas of focus for fundraising, with each providing supporters a different angle on conservation.

The Rocky Mountain Goat Alliance supports and conserves Rocky Mountain goat populations across North American Habitats.





How to give:

Donors can support RMGA through membership, operating funds, corporate sponsorships, or specific categories that best suit their interest and level of support. The primary funding avenues include citizen science, education, and the science and conservation committee.

Citizen Science

Citizen science projects allow RMGA and wildlife agencies to more accurately observe and forecast mountain goat populations, particularly in underfunded areas. RMGA members and volunteers, in partnership with local wildlife agencies, put boots on the ground to complete mountain goat counts in targeted areas.

Education

Education projects relate to the development and dissemination of public educational materials including hunter training, goat identification, and citizen science volunteer training. RMGA has led the creation of videos, digital and print materials, and webinars on a variety of mountain goat topics.

Science and Conservation Committee

RMGA facilitates a Research and Conservation Grant Program to support mountain goat research projects at various academic and professional levels. The Science and Conservation Committee, consisting of researchers and wildlife professionals, provides their expertise to review and make recommendations on grant submissions.
